

Call for Papers

Within Belgium's federal structure, the German-speaking Community is the institution territorially responsible for the recognised German-speaking area. It is governed by the Parliament of the German-speaking Community and the government of the German-speaking Community .

The Parliament publishes a **series of reports on the German-speaking Community**. Focused on political, legal, administrative and social topics, these reports look specifically at the situation of the Community in the following fields:

- The statute of autonomy
- Federalism
- The structure of Belgium as a federal state and its political system
- Cross-border cooperation
- Parliamentarianism and the government system
- Political representation
- Research into democracy and forms of democracy

The aim of the series is to document both the academic discourse and political and legal practice, and to promote political discussion and reflection.

We call on you to submit your papers dealing with questions and aspects relating to the German-speaking Community and concerning the above-mentioned topics. This call for papers also targets upcoming researchers.

In addition, you may also enter your papers (written in German, French, Dutch or English) for the "**Prize of the Parliament of the German-speaking Community**", awarded each year to promote academic support for the Community's development in the field of political science, with a focus on politics, law, economics and administration. The call for papers will be issued in January.
